AUTHOR COMMENTS: The paper presented by the authors is really interesting and thought-provoking and invites us to consider the management and use of parks from a different perspective.

I would only make one suggestion to the authors: to include a more current reference, corresponding to the years 2020-2022.

AUTHOR COMMENTS: This article is presented, on the whole, in a readable form. After detailed analysis, it appears that the article has a robust, coherent and well-organized structure.

Regarding the methodology used, it is not very clear, neither in the abstract, nor even in the methodology chapter.

It is not possible to know how the surveys were validated and what type of sample was used.

This is an article in the scientific area of the conference, since it focuses the study to urban parks, being this an integral part of the

set of public spaces for recreation and nature in cities and at the same time an integral part of the tourist offer of a destination. Thus, I consider the article pertinent and valid to be presented at ICOTTS22.

The article is well grounded in terms of literature review, and the references are considered current, however I believe that it could focus on even more current references, between the years 2021 and 2022.
