Dear Manuel,

Thanks very much for your reply.

Yes please try to reduce the introductory part focusing on theory as we will have a section focusing on this at the beginning of the book.

I understand your concern about the use of student's work and the ethical dilemma this presents. Perhaps you can do this without naming students and keeping anonymity as much as is possible. Another solution would be to keep your University anonymous, using a term such as 'a Mexican University'. Of course if you (quite rightly, it can be argued) want to indicate your good work at your University, then name it - but you may also need to ask permission at the University to do this! I have discussed students' work in my publications (books) but kept them and their actual university anonymous.

My comments about the abstract is based on my own experience of changing an article and then not immediately realising that this meant I had to change the abstract. In your case, the abstract may not need changing, but I would check.

I look forward to receiving a revised version of your interesting chapter!
